Soldier's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Gregg

I, J. T. Butts do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during the war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or (that I was in the service of the State of Texas during the war to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans.

That I was honorably discharged or surrendered at Marshall, Texas by reason of ending of war (date unknown)

(Give date and cause.)

that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D, 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees of \$300.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to \$300.00 per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$2000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State of the United States, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

- 2. Where were you born? Hancock County, Georgia
- 3. How long have you resided in Texas? 68 years exactly
- 4. In what county do you reside? Gregg
- 5. How long have you resided in said county? 68 yrs What is your postoffice address? Kelgore, Texas
- 6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? No

If rejected, state when and where.

- 7. In what State was the command in which you served organized? Texas
- 8. How long did you serve? about 2 yrs Give, if possible, the date of enlistment and discharge. Not known exactly.

9. What was the letter of your company, number of battalion, regiment or battery? belonged to Capt. Craig's Co. of Rusk County, Texas

10. If transferred from one command to another, give time of transfer, name of command and time of service not transferred

11. What branch of the service did you enlist in—infantry, cavalry, artillery or navy? infantry (short time cavalry)

12. What is the assessed value of your home, if you own a home? \$1000.00

13. What is the assessed value of your other property? none

14. Do you own any property other than that rendered for taxes in your county? If so, state value of same and county where located. No

15. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No

We are in receipt of your application for Confederate Pension but cannot approve same at this time on account of the following report which we have received from the office of the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C.

"The name J. T. Butts has not been found on the muster rolls on file in this office of Co. F. (Capt. W. D. L.F. Craig, of Rusk Co., Texas) 10th Regt., Texas Cavalry, C.S.A., which cover in part the period from Sept. 25, 1861 to April 5, 1864, nor has any record been found of his capture or parole as that organization."

Since your name has not been found on the muster rolls in that office of the Company in which you claimed to have rendered military service, it will be necessary before this application can be approved that you furnish the testimony of at least two creditable witnesses who personally know of your services you claimed to have rendered as a Confederate Soldier, or it may be proven by documentary evidence which you may have. This is the proof required under the statute of this State.

When the above proof has been furnished, your application will receive further consideration.

Dear Mr. Butts:

We have your letter of January 25th in which you state that your name as given in the War record is different from the way you signed your name in the application.

It would be unnecessary for me to ask the War Department for another record on your military service record, as they would only refer me to the one I have. If you care to have your County Judge of some one else write for your report you could probably get another get another report in regard to your record.

You spoke of one of the slaves belonging to your Father being alive, and could testify to your record as a Confederate Soldier. This would be alright, and his testimony would be considered if the County Judge of his County would certify that he is a creditable citizen and worthy of belief.

As for the affidavit of Mr. J. F. Reynolds, with reference to your military service record, you are advised that same is not in good form. I quote you below the statement in Mr. Reynolds affidavit:

"Mr. Reynolds served with Mr. J. T. Butt's Relatives in the Army and personally knows that Mr. Butts served in the War."

Instead of Mr. Reynolds affidavit containing a statement as shown above, he should tell what he knows and everything he knows about your service

as a Confederate Soldier.

If the affidavits, as above suggested, are filed with this office your application for pension will receive further consideration.

You are advised that this affidavit is very much in the form of the one filed heretofore in this case and signed by the witness J. F. Reynolds. Neither of these witnesses make any statement of facts that would prove the military service of Mr. Butts.

The statement of Calvin Brown is "that the said J. T. Butts did enlist in the Confederate Army and that he knows that the said Butts served in the Confederate Army." This is not proof of service as required by the statute, but the witnesses must state what they saw or what act of the applicant would cause them to determine in their minds that he was doing military service as a Confederate Soldier.

The application will not be passed upon finally, until Mr. Butts has an opportunity to comply with the requests mentioned.


