Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Gregg

I, Mrs. L. P. McAnally do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of John Ryan McAnally deceased, who departed this life on the 5th day of Sept, A. D. 1903 in the county of Cherokee in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 30th day of Jan A. D. 1883, in the county of Cherokee in the State of Texas

My husband, the said John Ryan McAnally enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States and he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State of the United States, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

14. Have you transferred to another any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? no

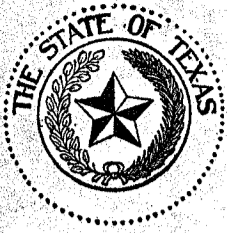

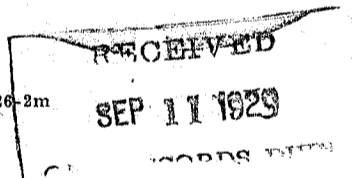

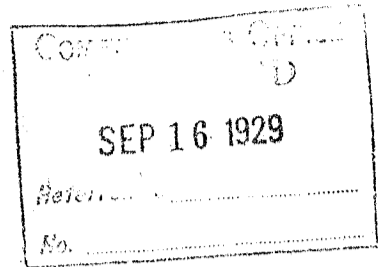

Texas Infantry, C.S.A., date & place of enlistment not shown, was captured March 14, 1864, at Fort De Russy, and confined at New Orleans, La., March 20, 1864, a Private. His name appears on a Roll of Prisoners of War transfd. from New Orleans, La., and exchanged at Red River Landing July 22, 1864, a Private. His name is not borne on the muster rolls of the Co., which rolls cover in part the period from Feb. 12, 1862 to Feb. 29, 1864. No later record found. Not found as John R. McAnally.

Dear Mrs. McAnally:

On May 23rd 1929, you filed an application for Confederate Pension with this office.

Since the filing of your application I have written to Hon. W. R. Hughes, County Judge, Longview two letters asking that information be furnished this office showing to whom the three-fourths interest in the ninety acres of land rendered to you for taxes belongs. It is shown in your application that you are the owner of one-fourth interest in this property. I would like to know whether this three-fourths interest is claimed by your children under the legal right given them by the statute, and if it is not claimed by your children then who is claiming this property, and under what right are they doing so.

Please state whether or not you are receiving the revenue from the entire ninety acres and what is the value of the ninety acres of land as shown by the rendition for taxes made to your State and County Tax Assessor.

Replying to your letter of August 5th which is in regard to an application for pension filed by Mrs. L. E. Smith.

You are advised that the application of Mrs. Smith was under an amendment to the pension law reconsidered on September 19, 1929 and was approved.

Mrs. Smith was notified in regard to this fact, but for some reason has never filed her affidavits for monthly payments, and it was supposed by this office that she was either dead or had left the state.

I am enclosing to you affidavits for quarterly and monthly payments to which Mrs. Smith are entitled. You will please have Mrs. Smith execute these affidavits and return them to this office as early as convenient and warrants for the amount due her will be issued.

A late amendment to the pension law, which become effective on June 19th, requires that pension payments now be made monthly, and in order that warrants can be issued promptly when due, it will be necessary for applicants for pension to have their affidavits for monthly payments executed and filed with this office by the 15th of each month. You will please call Mrs. Smith's attention to this request.

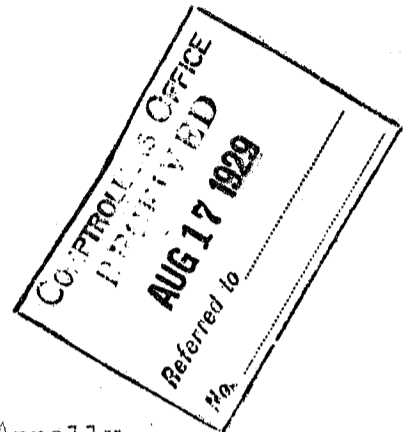
Your letter to Mrs. McAnnally has been ~~tx~~

Replying to your letter of February 4th in regard to pension payments made Mrs. Laura E. Smith, a Confederate pensioner, file number 46008, Victoria County.

You are advised that this application was granted on September 19, 1929 and the first pension payment that was due Mrs. Laura E. Smith was for the quarter which began September 1st and ended November 30, 1929.

It is shown by correspondence on file with this application that Mrs. Smith failed to execute the first affidavit for pension payment which was mailed to her and on August 8, 1930 we mailed her affidavits to be executed for all back payments then due which were for the quarters ending November 30, 1929, Feb. 29, 1930, May 31, 1930 and monthly payments for June and July, 1930. Dear Mrs. Smith:

Replying to your letter of June 6 you are advised the law of Texas permits Confederate Pensioners to temporarily leave the State of Texas and remain for a period of not more than six months, during which time their right as pensioners is not effected except that no pension warrants are issued during their absence. If your return to Texas should be within six months from the date of leaving then after your return back warrants will be issued to you for the time you have been away. But if for any reason you should remain out of Texas longer than six months, your name will be removed from the roll and no further payments will be issued to you.

Under this law it would be a violation for me to issue warrants to you and mail them to any one during your absence from the State of Texas.

If you should leave Texas on a visit or otherwise in July then you should immediately notify this office of the exact date of leaving, and when you return to Texas you should notify this office of the exact date of your return.

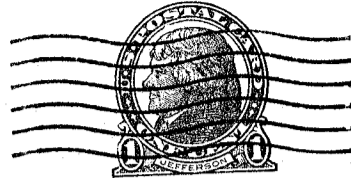
