THE STATE OF TEXAS }

County of Gregg }

I, Mrs Ann E. Renfro, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved March 26, A. D. 1909, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of Green C. Renfro, deceased, who departed this life on the 26 day of June, A. D. 1896; in the county of Gregg, in the State of Texas.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 28 day of September, A. D. 1865 in the county of Henry, in the State of Alabama.

My husband, the said Green C. Renfro, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate Service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to March 1, A. D. 1880, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? Sixty two
2. Where were you born? Borbon Co. Alabama
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? 38 years
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? And what is your postoffice address? 38 years Longview Texas P. O. #3
5. What was your husband's full name? Green Campbell Renfro
6. When and where were you married? Sept. 25 1865 Henry Co. Alabama
7. What was the date of his death? June 26th 1896
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Alabama
9. How long did your husband serve? If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge. of May 1861 to surrender until his surrender. Enlisted 15th day

10. What was the name or letter of the company, or name or number of the battalion, regiment or battery of artillery in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service. He enlisted & went to Virginia with 5th Alabama Regt. In winter of 1861 he was transferred to Co. G 13th Alabama Volunteer Infantry - 1863 He was detailed as a sharpshooter - Longstreet's Corps.

11. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. Infantry - A private



12. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? NO

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

And further make oath to the following facts touching the service of the applicant's husband in the Confederate Army:

The witness H. Whalley says:— I knew Green C. Renfro husband of applicant, before the war I lived within 4 or 5 miles of him and knew that he quit teaching school and enlisted in the Confederate Army going to Virginia in the 5<sup>th</sup> Alabama Regt. I did not served with him but remembered his coming home a short while after Lee's surrender at Appomattox 1865.

The witness C. B. McLeod says— I personally know that the said Green C. Renfro enlisted and served in the Confederate Army— I was in Co. B. 15<sup>th</sup> Alabama with him during most of the war. I slept with him nearly all the time— we went through to the surrender at Appomattox— He was in my Co. after the winter of 1861 when he was transferred from the 5<sup>th</sup> Alabama Regt. I know that he served honorably throughout —


