APPLICATION of Indigent Soldier or Sailor of the late Confederacy for pension under the Act of May 12, 1899.

To the Honorable County Judge of Harrison County, Texas.

Your petitioner, W. F. Shaddock respectfully represents that he is a resident citizen of Harrison County, in the State of Texas, and that he makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors, and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

NOTE—Applicant must make answer to all of the following questions, and such answers must be written out plainly in ink.

Q. What is your name? Answer W. F. Shaddock

Q. What is your age? Answer Sixty years old March 18, 1899.

Q. In what County do you reside? Answer Harrison

Q. How long have you resided in said County and what is your post office address? Answer Ever since 1872 P. O. Adams Longview Texas

Q. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate Pension Law heretofore, and been rejected? If so state when and where. Answer No -

Q. State whether or not you have received any pension or veteran donation land certificate under any previous law, and if you answer in the affirmative state what pension or veteran donation land certificate you have received. Answer none

Q. What real and personal property do you now own, and what is the present value of such property? Give list of such property and value. Answer
